The Radiant Church Mission Team of 16 members are home from their mission trip to the Tala, Kenya area. It was an awesome trip with great results. Our mission started on Saturday afternoon at the church in Itheuni. We were there to dedicate the recently completed well, funded by Radiant Church, Kalamazoo. We received a report of as many as 1,500 people coming in the morning to draw water and 500 people in the afternoon was common. Pastor Joel Doorlag and Ruth Okello presented an alter call at the end of the dedication. 67 teenagers came forward to accept Jesus.

Sunday the team attended Church at the TM Church plant in Ngunyumu, which was funded by Trinity Church. The church has a new Pastor, Virginia Kioko. Tom dedicated the new well and delivered a sermon on “the women at the well.” There were 30 residents in attendance and 12 accepted Christ at the end of the service. The blocks that are being stock piled from the excavation of the training center are being used in Ngunyumu. There was a new kitchen constructed and there are enough blocks to construct the church building. That afternoon the team attended a crusade at the Mithini local market, where Chad Linsley delivered a message on “Spiritual Blindness.” Three men accepted Christ. That brought the total number of converts to 82. Bwana Asifiwe or Praise the Lord.

The next 4 days were filled with conducting a vision clinic where 390 residents were seen and given glasses as needed. We also conducted health screening which consisted of taking histories, blood pressures, and glucose screening. Some of the people were referred for follow-up treatment to address eye problems and various health issues.

During the clinic Ruth took Tom, Karen, and Donna Linsley to the top of a mountain to see the well in Muumoni funded by Trinity Church. The property for the well was donated by the Salvation Army Church, which is located at the well site. The Pastor told us that some people in the community have been walking 9 miles down to the end of the valley to retrieve water. He said the well has made a tremendous difference in the quality of life for the people.
